falling, a cutting wind was blowing into our faces... finally after frequent danger of being suffocated in the snowdrifts, we arrived at the house of a poor gentleman... God be praised that He gave us the grace to suffer for the chair of Peter and on the day dedicated to chair founded upon the rock which, I hope, will in the long run break the violence of these tempestuous waves."

Commencing at 2.30pm on Saturday 22nd February, feast of the Chair of St Peter, at the house where St. Oliver resided at Doctor's Quarters (Map ref. 54.144553, - 6.465519) and following a short talk and blessing of the water in the nearby St. Oliver's Well, the Jubilee Pilgrims will walk two and a half miles via Daly's Bridge and Milltown to the church at Lislea. Vespers will be recited at 5.00pm, just as St. Oliver would have prayed on his arrival at the safe house, all those years ago.
